The International Arabian Horse Title Show is organized by the Association du Salon du Cheval (ASC), under the aegis of the ECAHO and in collaboration with the Société Royale Encouragement du Cheval (SOREC) and the Association Royale Marocaine des Eleveurs des Chevaux Pur Sang Arabe (ARMECPSA) It is organized under the ECAHO/EAHSC regulation 2025.

Conditions of Entry, Entry Restrictions and Qualification

The show is open to any Arabian horse registered in a recognized studbook on the date of registration and having obtained one of the following qualifications in 2025, 2024 and 2023:

- 1st to 5th place in the World Championship, a Title, an A show, a GCAT show or B show.
- 1st to 5th place in Yearling class at the World Championship, a Title show, and A show or a GCAT show.
- 1st to 5th place in a National Championship Show.
- 1st to 3rd place in a C International, C National, European Shows or EAHGC shows.
- 1st and 2nd place at Specific Origin Shows Yearlings do not need to qualify.

A quota per country may be set. Horse entries will be open from Thursday, July, 25th to Saturday, August 31th, 2025 and a selection committee will decide definitively on the entered horses.

The entries must be made only via:

The entry form must be signed and attached to the copy of the horse's passport, respecting the schedule below:

- Closing of preliminary entries: Saturday, August 31th, 2025
- Entries confirmation to participants: Sunday, September 1th, 2025

Classes and Championships

Class 1: 1-year-old fillies born in 2024
Class 2: 2 years old fillies born in 2023

Class 6: 1-year-old colts born in 2024
Class 7: 2 years old colts born in 2023

Class 3: 3 years old fillies born in 2022 Class
4: Females 4 to 6 years old (2021-2018) Class
5: Females aged 7 years and over

Class 8: 3 years old colts born in 2022
Class 9: Males 4 to 6 years old (2021-2018)
Class 10: Males aged 7 years and over.

The classification could be modified depending on the number and category of entries.

Yearling Female Championship – optionally if there is enough horses
Yearling Male Championship – optionally if there is enough horses
Junior Female Championship
Junior Male Championship
Senior Female Championship

Scoring during qualifying classes

Horses will be judged individually at the halt, walk and trot. Each judge will assign scores for type, head and neckline, body, legs and movements. The scoring system, out of 20 with ½ points will be adopted.

Qualification system for Championships

The top three horses in each category will be qualified to compete in their respective championship.

Rules for Championships: “Open method”

The Gold, Silver and Bronze medal winners will be selected from amongst all the horses which have qualified in their respective classes for each championship.

1. The Championships will be judged as follows:

- a. All the horses qualified for the championship will enter the ring and line up according to the numerical order of their catalogue numbers.
- b. The horses will be judged individually, standing and trotting.
- c. Each judge will nominate his choice for gold silver and bronze medals together at the same time, from amongst all the horses qualified for the championship.

Points will be given to the nominated horses as follows:

- A horse nominated by a judge for Gold Medal will receive 4 points.
- A horse nominated by a judge for Silver Medal will receive 2 points.
- A horse nominated by a judge for Bronze Medal will receive 1 point.

The Gold Medal will be awarded to the horse that obtains the most votes from the judges.

The Silver medal will be awarded to the horse that has obtained the greatest number of points after the Gold.

The Bronze medal will be awarded to the horse that has obtained the greatest number of points after the 2nd.

In the case of a tie, the Rules for Ties in championships will be followed.

The judges will not discuss the horses.

2. A fourth horse will be selected, which will become the bronze medal winner should one of the three medal winners be disqualified. If this exhibit is not apparent from the voting papers, the judges will be asked to nominate one. This horse will not be announced. In the event that two or more of the medal winners are disqualified, no further substitution will be made.
3. All horses that qualify for their respective Championships must take part in the Championship. Unless a certificate from the DC veterinarian is produced, failure to compete will disqualify the horse from the show

with its record of score and class placing being deleted and the horse being disqualified from showing for the period of one year as from the date of the show. In the event of a disqualification, horses placed behind the disqualified horse will move up a place in the class. Should a horse be sent out of the ring by the judges or taken out by the handler for any reason, it will be deemed to have taken part in the championship.

4. All horses that qualified for their respective Championship must remain at the showground until after their championships

Rules for Ties in Qualifying Places

In the event of a tie in the qualifying places of a class, the higher place will be given to the horse with the most points for type. If there is still a tie, the higher place will be given to the horse with the most points for movement. If the highest and lowest points are eliminated, only the remaining points for type and movement are considered in the tie break. Failing a decision on either of these, one judge will be chosen by ballot whose class scores will be used to break the tie.

Rules for Ties in Championships

In the event of a tie in the championships, the higher place will be given to the horse with the highest total points in the qualifying classes. If the highest and lowest points are eliminated, only the remaining points for total, type and movement are considered in the tie break. If there is still a tie, the rules for ties in qualifying places will be applied.

Arrival and departure of horses

Horses must arrive Saturday 27th & Sunday 28th and Monday September 29th, 2025 before 4 PM and must leave on Friday, October 03th, 2025 from 10 AM.

Commitments

Horse entries are free. The entry file consists of the following documents:

- The entry form, one copy per horse, on which is indicated the name of the handler in capital letters and must be signed by the owner of the horse or another authorized person;
- A copy of the horse's identification booklet or passport;
- The equine influenza vaccination certificate;
- A copy of the handler's passport or national identity card.
- A Copy of Vet certificate Hereditary Disorders

Failing this, the organizers will not accept the entry. No change of ownership can be considered by the organizers after the closing date for entries.

Responsibility

The organizers of Show "A" decline any liability for any accidents, material damage, illness or damage caused for and by a third party on the competition grounds and within the confines of the Show. Signing the entry form engages the owner's civil and criminal liability.

Handlers

Handlers must be over the age of 18, dressed in suitable attire, without any markings or distinctive features, and must be in possession of an ECAHO license in good standing.

The DC will scrupulously ensure compliance with the rules of ECAHO competitions in force (RCS), in particular, everything related to animal welfare (prohibition of plastic bags, etc.).

Veterinary visit

All horses are subject to a veterinary visit before admission to the Show stables from Sunday September 29th to Tuesday, October 01th, 2025.

Feeding the horses is in the charge of the owner. However, hay, straw, wood chips, as well as barley, oats and complete feed will be for sale on the site.

Horse number

The horse number will be given to the handlers after the veterinary and the disciplinary committee control on Tuesday, October 01th, 2025 from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. The horses will be accompanied by their identification and health documents.

Feeding

Feeding the horses is the responsibility of the owner. However, hay, straw, wood chips, as well as barley, oats and complete feed will be for sale on the site.

Stabling

A boxing area with litter will be reserved for the accommodation of horses on their arrival. A day and night security service will be provided, it is recommended that each person entitled to access the stables area have his access badge.

Veterinary care, farriery

The ASC will provide emergency veterinary care on the site of Salon du cheval. Farriery services are the exclusive responsibility of the participants.

Medication control

The medication testing of all Champion Gold Medal winners is compulsory. Any horse may be tested at the discretion of the DC. All medication testing will be conducted according to ECAHO Rules for Medication Control.

Qualifying classes

- Winners: 1st place : award plaques and rosettes.
- 2nd place: award plaques and rosettes.
- 3rd to 5th place: rosettes.

Championships

- Special Trophies.
- Award plates and rosettes.

Claims

Any complaint must be written and filed with the Disciplinary Committee, at the latest one hour after the facts and must be accompanied by an amount equivalent to 200 Euros in cash.

Insurance

All participants must have their personal insurance valid. Horses and equipment remain under the participants' care and responsibility for their attendance at the Salon du Cheval d'El Jadida.

Customs formalities

Each participant must take care, personally, of the transport of his horses and the expenses inherent in the administrative costs.
